## International Human Rights Day 2022

***“Truth is at the bottom of a well,” [Leonardo Sciascia]***

The [Section on Archives and Human Rights \(SAHR\)](#) of the International Council on Archives invites archivists, record keepers and professional archival associations to be a part of the observance of the United Nations' Human Rights Day celebrated every year on the 10th of December. It marks the day in 1948 when the United Nations General Assembly adopted the Universal Declaration of Human Rights (UDHR).

SAHR promotes the significance of archives and record keeping in defending and supporting human rights throughout the world and works with archivists, records managers, lawyers and all the people and institutions holding the same ethical commitment. We believe that inclusion, equity, and accuracy in recordkeeping and archives are essential components to the overall “truth” in supporting human rights. As Judge Rosario Salvatore Aitala recently stated, both archives and the law are essential bulwarks for Human Rights, and members of both professions are *“required to jump into the well to ensure that truth is protected for the good of all.”*
