Erik Reitzel, the inventor of the Symbolic Globe and Danish civil engineer and professor, specialized in bearing structures and minimal structural design resulting in major savings in construction materials.

To create Reitzel's Symbolic Globe, people from across the globe participating in the Summit on Social Development - perhaps the first cooperative international architectural project - put up the 15 meter globe in Copenhagen in 1995. It is now standing on the UNESCO piazza in Paris.





### Who knew? ... Smells, One more reason why we Preserve originals

We are routinely asked for reasons why originals should be preserved. Here is one of the most intriguing I have read about: Paul Duguid in his Trip Report from Portugal (pp 173-174 in: J.S.Brown & P. Duguid: The Social Life of Information, Harvard Business School Press, 2000.

"I was working in an archive of a 250-year-old business, reading correspondence from about the time of the American Revolution. Incoming letters were stored in wooden boxes about the size of a standard Styrofoam picnic cooler, each containing a fair portion of dust as old as the letters. As opening a letter triggered a brief asthmatic attack, I wore a scarf tied over my nose and mouth. Despite my bandit's attire, my nose ran, my eyes wept, and I

coughed, wheezed, and snorted. I longed for a digital system that would hold the information from the letters and leave paper and dust behind. One afternoon, another historian came to work on a similar box. He read barely a word. Instead, he picked out bundles of letters and, in a move that sent my sinuses into shock, ran each letter beneath his nose and took a deep breath, at times almost inhaling the letter itself but always getting a good dose of dust. Sometimes, after a particularly profound sniff, he would open the letter, glance at it briefly, make a note and move on. Choking behind my mask, I asked him what he was doing. He was, he told me, a medical historian. (A profession to avoid if you have asthma.) He was documenting outbreaks of

cholera. When that disease occurred in a town in the eighteenth century, all letters from that town were disinfected with vinegar to prevent the disease from spreading. By sniffing for the faint traces of vinegar that survived 250 years, and noting the date and source of the letters, he was able to chart the progress of cholera outbreaks. His research threw new light on the letters I was reading. Now cheery letters telling customers and creditors that all was well, business thriving, and the future rosy read a little differently, if a whiff of vinegar came off the page. Then the correspondent's cheeriness might be an act to prevent a collapse of business confidence -- unaware that he or she would be betrayed by a scent of vinegar."

# ARCHIVES ACROSS THE GLOBE


The 3rd International Conference on African Digital Libraries and Archives (ICADLA-3) took place at the end of May in Morocco. The topic of DIGITAL LIBRARIES AND ARCHIVES IN AFRICA: CHANGING LIVES AND BUILD-ING COMMUNITIES was presented and discussed at AL AKHAWAYN UNIVERSITY, IFRANCE. Topics for discussion included strategies for creating and maintaining a multinational digital library programme; digitisation platforms and services; creating value-added features for discipline-specific digital libraries; use of social media and outreach to increase use and build new audiences; and migration of projects to sustainable programmes.

This conference included participation from BHL global partners from Africa, the USA and Australia.

The International Conference on African Digital Libraries and Archives (ICADLA) is the major African forum focusing on digital libraries and associated technical, practical, organizational, and collaborative issues.

## + SUV Membership Survey - part two

### ICA-SUV 2013: BARBADOS

Please join us at the 2013 ICA-SUV Conference which will take place at the West Indies Federal Archives Centre of The University of the West Indies (UWI), Cave Hill Campus, from June 26-29, 2013. The conference focuses on "The New Age Archivist: Managing Archives in a Digital World. Emerging technologies



has resulted in the need for archivists to remain relevant by ensuring that their skills, theories, policies, procedures and practices are adequate to cope with the changing technological environment."

Keynote speakers at the conference will be Principal & Pro-Vice Chancellor Sir Hilary Beckles, Professor Luciana Duranti, Professor Emeritus Senator Henry Fraser, and Dr. Kenneth Thibodeau.

The conference will be held at the Main Campus of The University of the West Indies (UWI) on the Cave Hill Campus. This is one of four campuses of the university and caters to local, regional and international students. There are approximately 8,600 students at Cave Hill out of approximately 40,000 students across the four campuses; some of those students are part of an international student exchange programmes.

The West Indies Federal Archives Centre is situated on the Cave Hill Campus and preserves the records of the West Indies Federation (1958-1962) referred to as the Federal Archives fonds. The West Indies Federation was a short lived political union of ten territories of the former British West Indies. The Federal Archives fonds was inscribed on the UNESCO Memory of the World International Register in 2009 and represents a valuable resource for research into the regional integration efforts of the British West Indies. Additionally, the repository houses the records of other regional bodies as well as the archives of The UWI, Cave Hill Campus.

### ICA-SUV 2014: PARIS



The ICA- SUV board has formally accepted the proposal by French university archivists to host the 2014 SUV conference in Paris around the beginning of July 2014.

A programme committee has been selected and a call for papers will be issued in the next few weeks. Local conference organizers are already putting together lists of very affordable housing options in Paris and will the conference fee will be kept very low to allow more archivists to attend.



## **ONLINE BIOGRAPHY PROJECT**

In April the Editorial Board officially launched the new ICA-SUV Online Biography Project. By providing brie biographies of leading individuals in our field, we hope to facilitate communication, understanding, and learning across national boundaries when we attend international conferences, read respective literature, or want to gain a deeper understanding when we talk to colleagues from abroad about their field.

### PROVENANCE, CONTEXT, METADATA

The very recent disclosure of certain National Security Agency surveillance security programs in the United States has brought some issues to the forefront of public discussion with which archivists across the globe have long been familiar: namely, the importance of provenance, context, and more general metadata in giving meaning to individual records and generic units of content — in fact creating new content.
