<b>History:</b>	<i>The Arxiu Comarcal de l'Alt Empordà (ACAÉ) is integrated in the network of Regional Archives of the Generalitat of Catalonia, and its creation was agreed by the agreement signed on 31 January 1984 between the Department of Culture of the Generalitat de Catalonia and City Council of Figueres, which contributes to its maintenance. The Consell Comarcal of Alt Empordà has delegated the management since its creation. The official opening took place on 16 February 1991 with the assistance of the president of the Generalitat. Is installed in the west wing of the former municipal abattoir, a building built in 1907 by the modernist architect Josep Azemar. The main objective of ACAÉ is the conservation, protection and promotion of the documentary heritage, both private and public, in the Alt Empordà. 31 December 2014 the file custody documentation, which was m.l. 1,654 since the 11th century up to the present day.</i>
